

Haughtiness, the arrogance of the learned, That makes them forget the lessons earned, Love of praise, the desire to be adored, That makes them forget the divine reward.


Partisanship, the bias of belief, That blinds them to truth and causes grief, Trying to understand beyond capacity, That leads them to confusion and atrocity.

And sincerely glorify Allah in every way.


Offering Shukr is a great blessing, For which we should be grateful too, And by doing so, we keep ourselves, In a perpetual state of gratitude that's true.

To Him, the All-Knowing, Most Merciful Host.


Next, conduct with self, to be wary of,

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## Haughtiness and Humility.


Quran Surah 2 Ayat 9 They desire to deceive Allah and those who believe, and they deceive only themselves and they do not perceive
